
### BEHAVIORAL RED FLAGS OF FRAUD


Recognizing the behavioral clues displayed by fraudsters can help organizations more effectively detect fraud and minimize their losses.

#### **8 KEY WARNING SIGNS** OF ALL FRAUDSTERS These are the 8 most common behavioral clues displayed at least one of occupational fraud. These **5 red flags** were much more common among owner/executives



## GENDER AND RED FLAGS

Some behavioral flags tended to correlate with the fraudster's gender.



MORE COMMON WITH FEMALE FRAUDSTERS

Living beyond means	44%	37%
Financial difficulties	34%	<b>22</b> %
Recent divorce or family problems	17%	9%



MORE COMMON WITH MALE FRAUDSTERS

Unusually close association with vendor/customer	<b>23</b> %	13%
"Wheeler-dealer" attitude	13%	<b>5</b> %
Bullying or	13%	9%
